Audio Tour - Southbank Stroll

- London Eye (£27 entry) - one of the best views of London.
- Southbank Centre Food Market - Stop off for a bit of lunch.
- Southbank skate board park - Watch some of the talented kids perfect their flips and tricks.
- Theatre Avenue – see the world-famous Banksy painting of the girl with the balloon.
- Tate Modern - a free art gallery showcasing contemporary and modern art
- Golden Hinde - The first English ship to circumnavigate the globe between 1577 - 1580, captained by Sir Francis Drake. Take a look around, with a £5 admission cost, or just take your picture with the famous ship.

- Fortnum and Masons - one of London's famous department stores.
- Regent Street - you will find lots of shops. If you reach the top of the street, the road running perpendicular will be Oxford Street.
- National Gallery - With free access to over 2,300 paintings from altarpieces to the Impressionists, there's something for everyone at the National Gallery. And before you leave Trafalgar Square, take a picture with the famous lions.
- Changing of the guards - occurring every Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday at 11am.
- Churchills war rooms - Adults (16-59) costs £22 and Children (5-15) £11. Discover the secrets hidden beneath the streets of Westminster in the underground nerve centre where Winston Churchill and his inner circle directed the Second World War.
- Tate Britain - a free art gallery, is the home of British art from the 1500 to present day.



Audio Tour – London Rock and Roll Capital of the World

- Oxford Street
- British Museum – a huge showcase for global antiquities, including Egyptian mummies and ancient Greek sculptures. It's completely free!
- Soho - Enjoy something to eat in one of the many restaurants. Here you will find some of the most creative chefs putting their talent on display.
- Regent Street - explore the endless shops
- Royal Academy of Arts - delve into cutting-edge ideas in architecture, explore work by current students at the school and discover installations by today's top contemporary artists. The school also host performances and if you're lucky enough you may be able to witness some of the musical talent on offer here.
- Regents Park - Explore the park, which includes London Zoo, Queen Mary's Rose Garden, a boating lake and the beautiful English Gardens.
